



Endowment

Air Conditioning Installed for Classrooms 1-4 Endowment is Matching all Donations

At the suggestion of many who were interviewed by our building steering committee this Spring, and with the support and partnership of church council, air conditioning was installed in June in the first four rooms of the education wing. These rooms are used by several groups throughout the year, including summer. Positive feedback and appreciation have since been received from our quilters, various committees and others that use these rooms. It was great to get this done so quickly so that our congregation could enjoy this improved space prior to the hot weather.

To help defray the cost which was approximately \$4,300, the opportunity to contribute to an air conditioning (a/c) fund was communicated in July. Thank you to everyone who has donated to date. To close the gap which remains significant, Endowment has agreed to match all previous donations, plus those made to the a/c

fund between now and December 1. The Endowment Fund supports educational programs and capital improvements beyond those that might not otherwise be able to be provided through Advent's regular operating budget. We believe this project is a nice example of how a collaborative spirit among all involved continues to move us forward.

The Benefits of Pumpkin (reprinted from 2016) by Megan Minotas

I, along with a majority of Americans, am ecstatic that it is fall because fall is my favorite season. Warm days, cool nights, football, leaves changing color, apple picking, apple cider, and most of all pumpkins! My daughters also love pumpkins because they enjoy our yearly ritual of going to the pumpkin patch and picking out the perfect pumpkin, but I love pumpkins for a whole other reason. I love to cook and bake with them and make savory or sweet dishes and of course pumpkin pie. What people may not know is the pumpkin is a great resource for a variety of reasons. Here are some of the top health benefits of pumpkins:

- **Vision:** A cup of cooked, mashed pumpkin contains more than 200 percent of your recommended daily intake of vitamin A, which aids in vision. Pumpkins are also rich in carotenoids, which gives the gourd their bright orange color, including beta-carotene, which the body converts into a form of vitamin A for additional peeper protection.
- **Fiber:** Pumpkin is an often-overlooked source of fiber, but with three grams per one-cup serving and only 49 calories, it can keep you feeling full for longer on fewer calories.
- **Cholesterol lowering:** Pumpkin seeds are naturally rich in certain plant-based chemicals called phytosterols that have been shown in studies to reduce LDL or "bad" cholesterol.
- Cancer fighting: Like their orange comrades the sweet potato, the carrot and the butternut squash, pumpkins boast the antioxidant beta-carotene, which may play a role in cancer prevention. And the plant sterols in pumpkin seeds have also been linked to fighting off certain cancers.
- **Fighting wrinkles:** The same free-radical-neutralizing powers of the carotenoids in pumpkin that may keep cancer cells at bay can also help keep the skin wrinkle-free.
- Potassium: A cup of cooked pumpkin has the refueling nutrient of potassium with 564 milligrams. A little extra potassium helps restore the body's balance of electrolytes after a heavy workout and keeps muscles functioning at their best.

While it is easier and convenient to buy the canned version of pumpkin, it is healthier and pretty simple to make your own. Buy a baking or pie pumpkin (they are the smaller size), cut it into fourths. Scrape out the seeds (save them to bake later and have as a tasty snack!), roast in a 350 degree oven for forty-five minutes or until fork tender. Let them cool and peel off the skin. Put the pumpkin in a food processor or blender and process till smooth. You may have to add water to help it puree. Use right away in your favorite recipe or freeze to use later. I use my pumpkin puree in waffle recipes, making soups, breads and I even use it to make a sauce for my pasta dishes. So next time you are at the pumpkin patch or even the grocery store, try buying a baking pumpkin and explore everything this gourd has to offer.



- Website Update: It is being worked on. Will have new platform, new server, new look with fresh ideas. A team is in place working on this, along with our web designer.


New Business and any other business:
